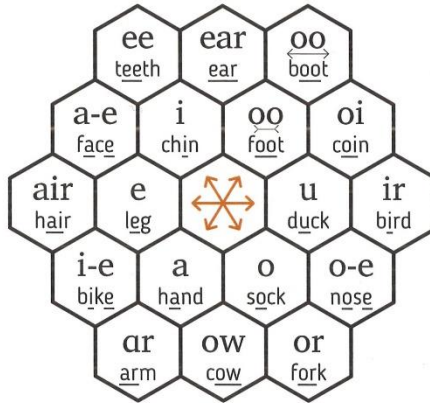


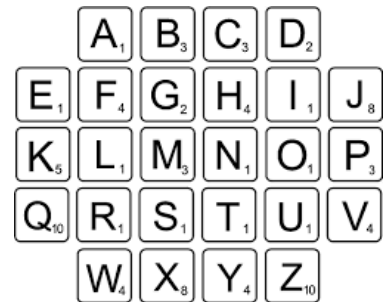

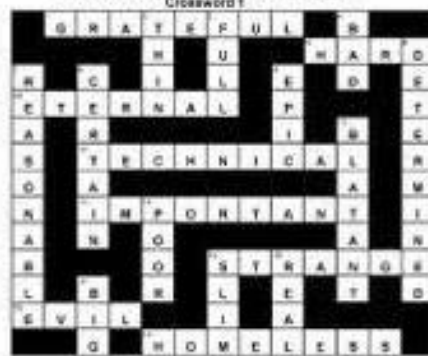

## ADJECTIVES CROSSWORD



<b>IDIOM</b> A group of words that are used together to have a special meaning. EXAMPLE: 'It's raining cats and dogs' means it is raining very hard.	<b>HYPERBOLE</b> An exaggeration that is not meant to be taken literally. EXAMPLE: 'I'm starving!' when you have just eaten.	<b>PERSONIFICATION</b> Giving human qualities to an object or animal. EXAMPLE: 'The wind whistled through the trees.'
<b>CLICHE</b> A phrase that has been used so often that it has lost its original meaning. EXAMPLE: 'It's a piece of cake' when the task is difficult.	<b>ALLITERATION</b> The use of words that begin with the same letter or sound. EXAMPLE: 'Peter Piper picked a peck of pickled peppers.'
